

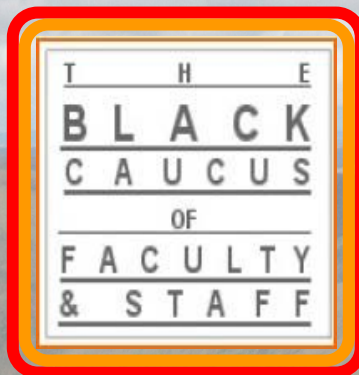



# KEYNOTE SPEAKER

## Ms. Kasiemobi Onyejekwe



Kasiemobi Onyejekwe (Kasi) is the daughter of Nigerian immigrants and was born in Chicago, IL. Her mother practiced pharmacy and her father is a mechanic. She has an older sister and a younger brother. Observing her parents continue to transition into American culture, she noted the dedication, openness, and resilience necessary to grow up between two cultures. Kasi watched her family devote themselves not only to their lives in America but also to their families back home in Nigeria. They contributed supplies for and participated in medical missions to her father's village in Nigeria. These medical missions in Nigeria peaked her initial interest in a career in the medical field. They participated in medical mission trips to Nigeria every three years in order to promote the importance of health awareness among families in the village of Oraifite. Three days were dedicated to patient care in which doctors and pharmacists evaluated and diagnosed 1500 villagers.

After graduating high school at St. Ignatius College Prep, Kasi transitioned to Purdue University and majored in Chemistry with minors in Forensic Science, Spanish, and Psychology. She served as a peer mentor to undergraduate students in the Women in Science Program (WISP) and Learning through Experience and Awareness in Diversity Program (LEAD). Kasi engaged in weekly activities with her WISP mentees and promoted campus-wide diversity through workshops in the residence halls with the LEAD participants. In the summer of 2010, she had the opportunity to attend the Summer Medical and Dental Education Program (SMDEP) in Houston, Texas, which not only strengthened her dedication to medicine but reinforced the importance of academic and professional flexibility and cultural awareness. Kasi served as a resident assistant, tutor and Emily Mauzy Vogel Leadership Conference participant, to name a few.

During her second year at Purdue Kasi met her husband, a fellow chemistry major when a mutual friend requested tutoring help in some of her courses. During her tenure at Purdue, she earned a spot on the Dean's List for consecutive semesters and received awards through the Louis Stoke's Alliance for Minority Participation (LSAMP), Discovery Park Undergraduate Research Internship (DURI) and the Black Caucus of Faculty and Staff.

After graduating from Purdue University in 2012, Kasi continued her education at Indiana University School of Medicine. She is scheduled to earn an MD in May 2016 and will begin her residency with at the University of Cincinnati as she pursues her dream of becoming a surgeon.

In her spare time, Kasi enjoys engaging in yoga and pilates. She also enjoys outdoor activities such as biking, roller blading and hiking. Kasi and her husband have an interest in international cuisine and challenge themselves to cook a new dish each week.

## Lift Every Voice and Sing

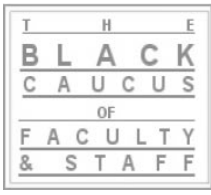

We have come, treading our path through the blood of the slaughtered,  
Out from the gloomy past,  
Till now we stand at last

God of our weary years,

## The Black Caucus

The Caucus traces its roots to discussions and informal meetings among African American faculty and staff on the Purdue University West Lafayette campus in the Fall of 1970. The concept for an organized group of Black faculty and staff initially was circulated by Dr. Buchanan, who held the position of Coordinator of Black Student Programs at the time. These discussions continued over the next few years until September, 1974, when faculty and staff members responded positively to a proposal from Mr. Sam Hay, Director of Africana Studies and Research Center, to develop a more formal organizational structure. An ad hoc leadership group began planning for the goal with monthly meetings at the old Black Cultural Center.

Under a constitution ratified in December 1974, African American faculty and staff members voted on April 17, 1975 to establish the *Black Faculty and Staff Council of Purdue University*, and elected as its first officers Dr. Luther Williams (Chairperson), Ms. Marion Blalock (Vice Chairperson), Dr. Darlene [Clark-] Hine (Recording Secretary–Treasurer), Mrs. Helen Bass Williams (Corresponding Secretary), Mr. Kenneth McNight (Parliamentarian), Capt. Jerome Adams, Mr. Samuel Hay, and Ms. Phoebe Coleman (Members-at-Large). Purdue President Arthur G. Hansen was duly notified later that month. By the Spring of 1976, the organization became known as the *Black Caucus of Faculty and Staff*.

The basic purpose, goals, and objectives of the Caucus have remained consistent across the life of the organization, and are articulated most clearly in its Constitution and Bylaws (1984):

“The purpose of the Purdue Black Caucus of Faculty and Staff shall be:

- (a) To identify and act upon those issues which affect Black people at Purdue University and the greater Lafayette community, especially as they relate to the function of the University;
- (b) To institute and maintain an effective and positive relationship between the University and its Black constituency both on and off campus;
- (c) To reinforce self-awareness among Black people by implementing programs and activities designed to achieve these aims;
- (d) To gather and disseminate information about available talent, opportunities, and activities that will provide the University with a comprehensive understanding of the dynamics of the Black experience;
- (e) To carry out other activities of a charitable and educational nature to promote the welfare of Black faculty, staff, and students.”

From its earliest years, the Caucus undertook monitoring the number and status of African American staff and students at Purdue, providing mutual support, and engaging upper administration in planning for change and advancement on matters of concern. One important, visible, and consistent function has been the Annual Awards Program. Initially begun as an “Academic Support Fund Dance” that raised money for academic merit awards and a possible emergency loan fund, the Caucus distributed 30 “incentive awards” to Black students for the end of the 1975-76 academic year. The Second Annual Academic Support Fund Dance honored 60 outstanding Purdue Undergraduates with cash awards, gifts, and certificated for excellence in scholarship, community service, and leadership. Continuing its tradition of honoring students using only voluntary donations, this 41st Annual Program will honor over 150 undergraduates of African descent at Purdue University.



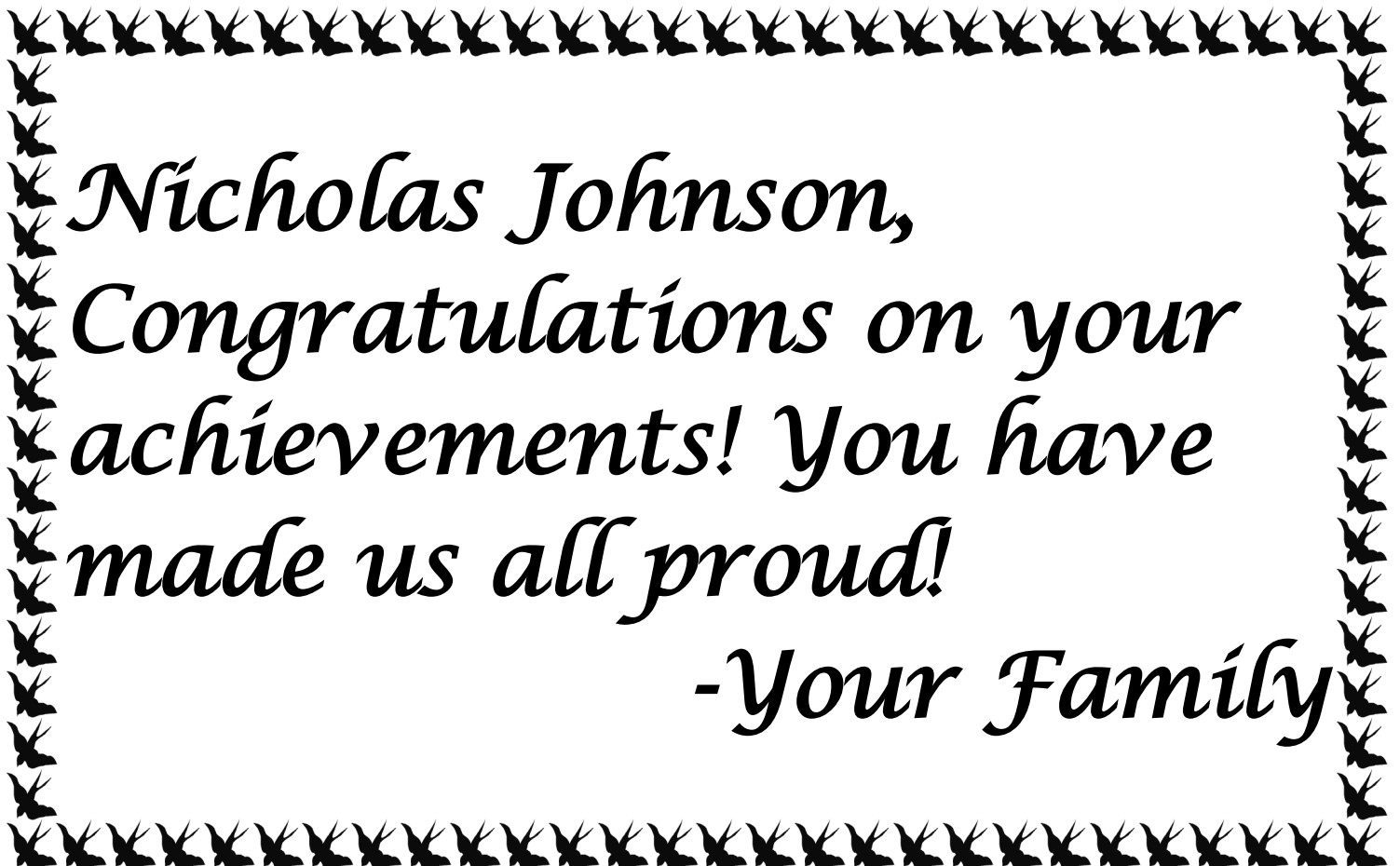

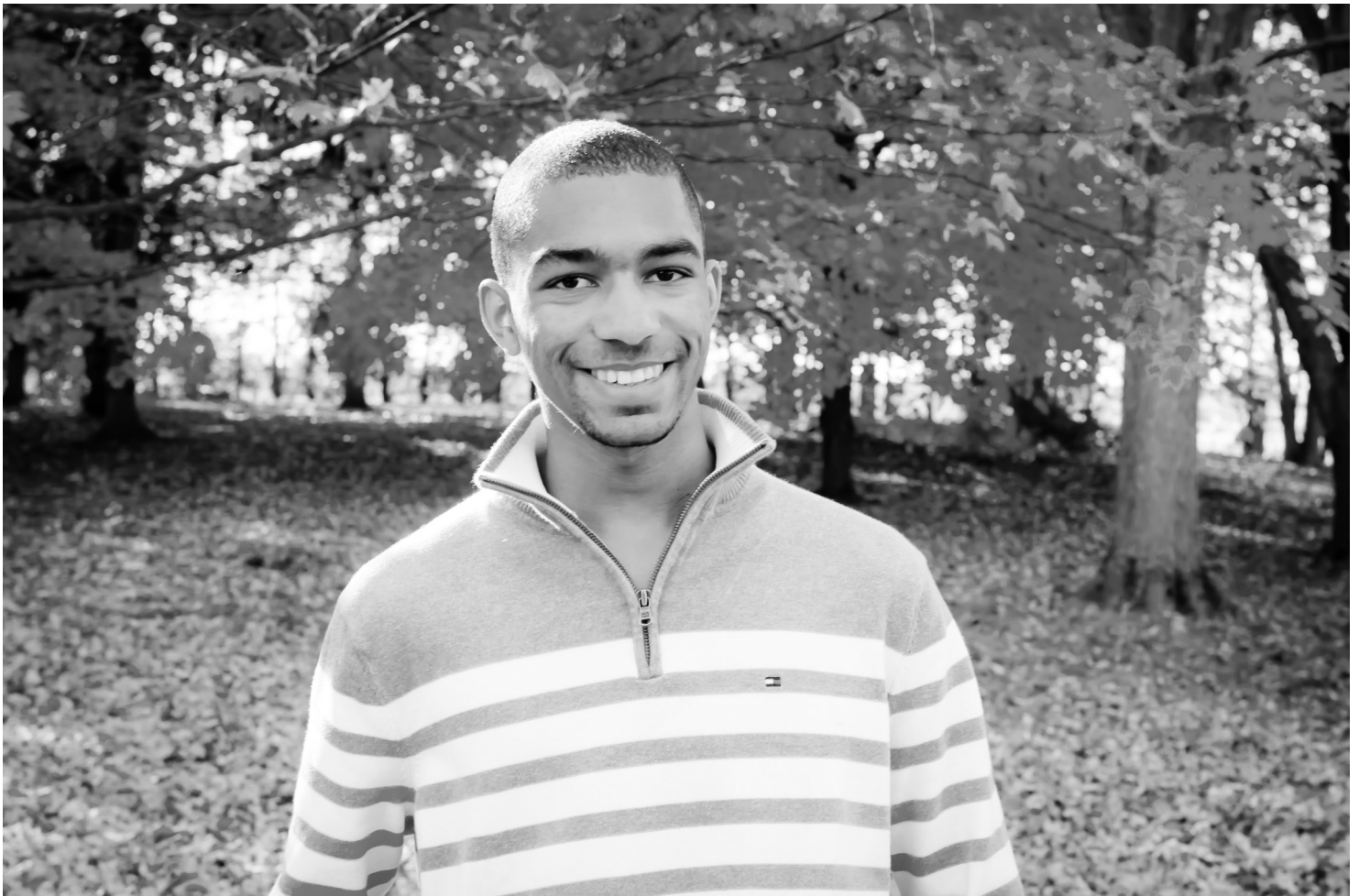
